Routine bills in the amount of \$75,733.68 were approved for payment.

Scott Syrcle brought a spreadsheet which showed the amount that Pike County would lose from the state's reduction in the distribution amount of Personal Property Replacement taxes. Instead of the 10.64% I reported last month we will lose 25% or \$31000.

We then discussed the budget process and changes affecting the revolving loan fund.

Rodger Hannel made a motion to pay the bills. Amy Gates seconded. Motion carried.

Amy Gates made a motion to adjourn and Rodger Hannel seconded. Motion carried.

# **Building & Grounds**

Building and Grounds Committee Meeting----9-20-2017

The Building and Grounds Committee met at 3:30 pm on Wednesday, September 20, 2017, at the Pike County Government Building. Those present were: Rodger Hannel, Derek Ross, Carrie Martin, Andy Borrowman, Donnie Apps, Jane Johnson, and John Birch. Absent were: Darwin Feenstra and Sheriff Paul Petty.

The main issue of the meeting was to discuss the Building and Grounds budget for 2018. The committee reviewed last year's budget and reviewed the current Building and Grounds expenditures so far for this budget year. So far we have spent about 69% of our projected budget. The committee decided to ask Jim Sheppard and Darwin Feenstra some questions about what might need to be considered for the 2018 budget before compiling our 2018 B & G budget.

Jane Johnson mentioned that Chris Johnson referred Max Middendorf about doing a stability/structural analysis for the lot east of the Pike County Government Building. Max offered to see if he could interest a vendor or vendors to do a free ground-penetrating assessment. The B & G committee thought this was a great idea, and will discuss this with Sheriff Petty.

A motion to approve the bills in the amount of \$11,068.10 was made by Carrie and seconded by Derek. (Later Ann Moffit said that the utility bills were left out and needed to be included: City of Pittsfield \$158.96 and Homefield Energy \$3,249.13. The actual total for the month should be \$14,476.49.) Motion passed.

A motion was made by Carrie Martin and seconded by Derek Ross to adjourn the meeting at 4:15 pm. Motion passed.

Engineering, Inc. for replacement of existing structure 075-3162. The structure is located on Township Road 376 over South Prong of Spring Creek in Section 27, Spring Creek Township. Motion carried.

**ROLLER PURCHASE:** A motion was made by Fred Bradshaw, seconded by Rodger Hannel to purchase a roller from Atlas Township in the sum of \$4,000.00. Motion carried.

#### Public Safety

Pike County Public Safety Committee

9/19/2017

The Pike County Public Safety Committee met on Sept. 19, 2017 at the Ambulance HQ at 7pm. Those present include Pike County Board Chairman Andy Borrowman, Derek Ross, Carrie Martin, Bryce Gleckler, Ambulance Administrator Josh Martin, Ron Goewey, Josh Forbis, Clay Lister, and Jay Albert.

Bills for the month totaled \$293,563.91. Income for the month totaled; \$131,984.49. A motion to pay the bills was made by Glecker and seconded by Ross. The motion passed.

Jane Johnson of the Pike County Health Department shared information about changes to the county Food Sanitation Program Ordinance. The State has mandated that changes be made to reflect regulations according to the FDA. The changes will include a new inspection form and will be moving away from the grading system that the local food industry is used to. As a result, enforcement procedure that is maintained via the Pike County Code Hearings will also need some adaptation. These changes are mandated by July 2018. The PCHD is moving forward with these changes in anticipation of the mandate.

The new ambulance should arrive by 9/22/17 and will begin getting prepared for inspection so it can be fully utilized as soon as possible.

Administrator Martin shared that the Pike Emergency Management dept was notified of a grant award in the amount of \$20,879.40. The funds will be used to improve capacity for the EOC. There were 112 agencies who applied for these funds. Only 33 of the applicants were selected. Martin indicated he has not been notified when the funds will be released.

Administrator Martin plans to apply for two grants from the AFG (Assistance to Firefighters Grant) as soon as he is able to do so. Grant categories include Fire and EMS Operations and Safety Grants, Firefighting and Emergency Vehicle Grants and Fire Prevention and Safety Grants.

Next month, the committee plans to begin working on a strategic plan of operations to assist in having short and long-term goals for PCAS.

A motion to adjourn was made by Gleckler and seconded by Ross. The motion passed.

The meeting adjourned at 7:57pm.

Rodger Hannel made a motion to approve the Public Safety Committee minutes as presented. Bryce Gleckler seconded the motion. Voice vote was 8-0 to approve, motion carried.

#### AGRICULTURE COMMITTEE

Agriculture Committee Meeting—Pike County Government Building—September 18, 2017, 7:30 pm

Those present at the Ag Committee meeting on September 18, 2017, were: Chairman Fred Bradshaw, Rodger Hannel, Bryce Gleckler, County Board Chairman Andy Borrowman, Blake Roderick, Jane Johnson, Debbie Lambeth, Chris Johnson, Fred Ruzich, and Zack Boren.

The meeting began with Debbie Lambeth giving an Animal Control report. Debbie presented a list of nine issues that still need to be addressed at the animal shelter. Fred Bradshaw has addressed these issues again with John Hayden, the Pittsfield mayor. Fred has informed the mayor that there will be no Open House at the new animal shelter until these issues are resolved. The list will be given out at the full County Board meeting on 9-25-17.

Jane Johnson had no report for the Ag Committee.

In the Solid Waste report, Chris Johnson stated that 2000 tons from the Higbee School demolition were taken to the landfill. The landfill host agreement allows some flexibility to go over for public entities to take their trash to the landfill. Also, Chris mentioned that the Pike County clean-up day is Saturday, October 7, 2017, from 8:00 am to noon, when Pike County residents can take one car or pick-up load of trash to the landfill for free. In addition, Chris mentioned that revenue to the county has increased to \$383,000 from an earlier average of about \$200,000.

Fred Ruzich gave a brief zoning report. Fred is busy working on catching up getting properties assessed that were omitted in the past. Fred will be working with Zack Boren on writing a proposed Pike County ordinance for possible solar farms that might want to build in Pike County. Blake Roderick discussed the proper steps to establish a solar ordinance in the county that would comply with AIMA (Agriculture Impact Mitigation Association). The solar ordinance must be referred to the planning commission and zoning board of appeals before going to a vote by the full Pike County Board.

Rodger Hannel made a motion at 8:34 pm to adjourn the meeting. Bryce Gleckler seconded the motion, and the motion passed.

Carrie Martin made a motion to approve the Agriculture report as presented. Bryce Glecker seconded the motion. Voice vote was 8-0 to approve, motion carried.

The GIS committee of the Pike County board met on Tuesday September 12, 2017 at the Emergency Operations Center in the Pike County Jail. Those present were; Amy Gates, Jim Sheppard, Andy Borrowman, Sandy Schacht, and Doug White.

Amy Gates made a motion to pay the bills in the amount of \$125.00. Jim Sheppard seconded, motion carried. We also sent one bill back to Sandy Schacht for more information.

The committee reviewed the Wi-Fi problem in the courthouse and the government building. We also discussed access points in the courtrooms and Amy Gates inquired as to how much we had spent on ETC this year.

We then worked on the GIS budget and will finish it at a budget hearing. Amy Gates made a motion to adjourn. Jim Sheppard seconded, motion carried. Meeting adjourned at 7:27PM
