

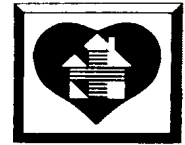

**TITLE:** Children's Flu Clinics

### CONTENT:

Pike County Health Department will offer **children's** flu vaccination walk-in clinics on the following days and times:

Monday, October 4<sup>th</sup> 1:30 – 6:00 pm  
Monday, October 18<sup>th</sup> 1:30 – 6:00 pm  
Monday, October 25<sup>th</sup> 1:30 – 6:30 pm

The clinic will be held at Pike County Health Department, 606 W. Adams Street in Pittsfield. **Please use main entrance located on Franklin Street.** A parent or guardian must sign consent forms for those under 18 years of age.

The cost for the flu vaccine for children varies, based on program eligibility. Out of pocket fee for injectable flu vaccine is \$35.00. Cash, check, credit card, or Medicaid is accepted. There is no cost to those covered by Medicaid. Insurance billing for most private health insurance plans is also available.

Adult injectable flu vaccine is \$35.00 (or no cost if billed to Medicare or Medicaid). Adult flu clinics will be held on the following Friday's, October 1<sup>st</sup>, October 8<sup>th</sup>, October 15<sup>th</sup>, October 22<sup>nd</sup>, and October 29<sup>th</sup> from 9:30 am – 4:30 pm.

The CDC recommends everyone six months and older receive the flu vaccine. People at high risk of serious flu complications include young children, pregnant women, and people with chronic health conditions like asthma, diabetes or heart and lung disease. **Senior dose flu vaccine is available for those 65 years and older.**
