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PCHD News Release COVID-19 Case Numbers Significantly Decline in Pike County, IL

FOR IMMEDIATE RELEASE March 8, 2022

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Pike County, IL – COVID-19 case numbers have significantly declined in Pike County, IL since the first of the year. In January 2022, Pike County Health Department (PCHD) was notified of 1,172 new cases of COVID-19 and 12 COVID-19 related deaths. In February 2022, PCHD was notified of 170 new cases and 2 COVID-19 related deaths. According to the Centers for Disease Control and Prevention (CDC), 40.8% of Pike County residents are fully vaccinated as compared to **71.9%** statewide.
